
Books on Books #13

Ed van der Elsken: Sweet Life



Ed van der Elsken's *Sweet Life* published in 1966 is considered one of the key works of Dutch photobook history. In 1960, armed with two magazine commissions and a stipend from Netherlands television, Ed van der Elsken and his wife Gerda set off on a fourteen-month journey around the world. Six years after their return, he published his travelogue *Sweet Life* which exhibited a panoply of layout effects - double-page bleeds, crops, printed in deep gravure, and different cover designs for each of the six countries in which it was published. *Books on Books #13* presents a study of this classic book with a contemporary essay by Frits Gierstberg.

Ed van der Elsken (1925-1990) - the 'enfant terrible' of Dutch photography - was a photographer and filmmaker who expressed his meetings with people in photos, photo books and films for more than forty years. Strolling through cities such as Paris, Tokyo, Hong Kong and Amsterdam or travelling through Africa and Japan, he preferably took photographs of striking individuals with character. His first photo book, published in 1956, *Love on the Left Bank*, instantly made him world famous. He produced over twenty photo books. He also made several television films, mostly about subjects regarding his own life.

Essayist Frits Gierstberg is an art historian, critic and curator. He works as Head of Exhibitions at the Nederlands Fotomuseum in Rotterdam and publishes regularly on photography. His most recent publication co-written with Rik Suermondt is *The Dutch Photobook* (NAi Publishers/Aperture, 2012).
